Supplies:

- Coordinating [Thread](#)
- Fabric, see pattern for yardage
- [Marking Pen](#), temporary
- Elmer's School Glue, washable

- [Fineline Glue Tips](#) (for Elmer's Glue)
- [Heavy Duty Freezer Paper](#)
- [Easy Press Pen](#) or [Spray Starch](#)
- [Fabric Scissors](#)
- [Snips](#), optional
- [Rotary Cutter](#)
- [Rotating Mat](#) for rotary cutting, optional
- Sewing machine with an open toe foot and a 1/4" foot

Before Class:

1. Order the [Poppy Louise Quilt Pattern](#) and [supplies](#) at SnapdragonQuilting.com or purchase in class.
2. [Starch](#) fabric - Curves require working with bias. Starching fabric **before cutting** helps reduce distortion.

3. Refer to the Block BC (Bonus Colorway) Diagram, cut:

Fabric 1:

- (1) 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" square, fussy cut
- (2) 2 3/4" x 2 3/4" squares
- (2) 1 1/4" x 8" strips

- (2) 1 1/4" x 6 1/2" strips

Fabric 2:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip
- (2) 1" x 3 3/4" strips
- (2) 1" x 2 3/4" strips

Fabric 3:

- (2) 3 3/4" x 3 3/4" squares

Fabric 4:

- (2) 1 7/8" x 6 1/2" strips
- (2) 1 7/8" x 3 3/4" strips

4. Prepare Templates: Cut out template A. Print or copy templates B and C onto [freezer paper](#), cut out.
